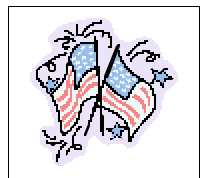

Please take advantage of this easy fundraiser! Using a Kroger card helps the Centerville Band and lowers your band fees at the same time! You can purchase a Kroger Card from the CBB for \$5 - it has a total starting value of \$5 already on it. You can use it at any Kroger in the United States – buy one for your out of town relatives as well!

When you use the card for your Kroger purchases, they send a check to the Centerville Band Boosters for 4% of the total purchase. The CBB will credit you 40% of these profits toward your band fees.

It's Not Too Early to Think About Band Camp

Band Camp is the first time the whole band works intensively on the 2006 competition show. It is the key element in establishing the positive attitude and team spirit that is the hallmark of the JAZZ. Band Camp is required for ALL band members. Both Marching and Color Guard! Incoming Freshmen and rookies, be prepared to work, march, spin, perform and have a great time!

Band Camp Room Mate Request form needs to be filled out and signed by requesting students and returned to Bruce and Marygrace Miller before July 1st. All Band Camp forms can be found at Centervilleband.org website, and click on the Forms link to go to a specific form. Those students not submitting roommate forms by July 1st will be assigned a random room placement and they cannot be altered once they are set in place.

Band Camp at Miami University

Dates: July 25 – 28

Parents Show: Friday, approx. 5:30pm – 6:00pm

Residence: Morris Hall, Miami University

Items Provided: Sheets, pillows, one blanket, towels and washcloths

Dorm Room Key: A \$20 deposit (exact change or check made payable to CBB) is required at room check-in. The deposit will be returned after your key is returned. You will receive a Miami University lanyard to hold the key. If the key is lost, your deposit is kept and you are charged an additional \$30 in accordance with the strict Miami University policy.

Dorm Room Walls: Only Keene-Tac (white color) or E-Z cups can be used to hang things on the dorm walls. Absolutely no tape can be used! Since the band is fined for use of tape, students who use tape will be fined also. In addition, anyone who uses tape on any wall or door surface will make his or her room ineligible for the room decoration contest. Decorating is optional.

Spending Money: Bring extra money for pizzas (after evening practices), pop, snacks, etc. (but not too much).

Things to Bring: One labeled suitcase, sunscreen, mosquito spray, band tour shirt and black shorts, one cool weather marching outfit (it can be cool in the mornings), hot weather practice clothes, marching tennis shoes (not new), toilet articles, deodorant, swimsuit, snacks that need no refrigeration, alarm clock, WATER BOTTLE, coins for vending machines and an extra blanket if you have space (the air conditioning can run cold in the dorm).

Things Not to Bring: Fans, expensive stereo equipment or anything of great value.

Water: Marching Bands need water! Be sure to send lots of water with your student to all practices. It is very important to keep well hydrated during this time of year. Also don't forget sunscreen (especially if your student is on any medication), long-sleeve shirts and hats. Students don't often think it's important and parents need to keep reminding them. It's also good to have a sweatshirt along in case it turns cool.

Transportation: Transportation to Miami is via school busses. Students may not drive to Miami University. Transportation home from Band Camp is the parents' responsibility after the parents' show at approximately 6:00pm on July 28th. Times may vary so please come early. There is no way for us to guarantee an exact time.

Parking: Park anywhere near the dorm. Illegal parking will be ticketed (yellow curbs, grass, etc.). Bring your lawn chair or blanket for visitor seating.

Directions to Miami University: Take I-75 south to Route 63 West in Monrow. Go west on 63 to Route 4. Go north on Route 4 to Route 73. Take 73 West to Miami U. When entering the university, turn left on Patterson, then right on Spring St., then left on Maple Ave. Morris Hall and the Field are on your left, about half the way down the street.

We strongly encourage this route and we strongly discourage anyone from staying late on Senior Night. Families, if your plans absolutely require you to be around campus that night, we respectfully request that you stay in an Oxford hotel, and not drive back to Centerville in the dark.
