

Constitution of the Centerville Band Boosters Association, Inc.

Article I. Title

The name of this organization shall be the Centerville Band Boosters Association, Incorporated, hereafter referred to as the Association.

Article II. Statement of Purpose

The purpose of the Association is to provide moral, human resource and financial support to the Band Programs of Centerville City Schools. The Association shall be operated as a not-for-profit organization consistent with the requirements of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article III. Membership

Section 1. Membership in the Association shall be open to any and all parents or guardians of students involved in one or more of the Centerville High School Band programs, hereafter referred to as the Programs.

Section 2. Membership confers eligibility to hold Executive Board and other positions of responsibility with the Association.

Section 3. Membership entitles each family in good standing to cast a single vote for each participating student at General Meetings of the Association.

Article IV. Officers

Section 1. The elected officers of the Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. The office of Second Vice-President is non-elective and shall automatically be held by the Centerville High School Band Director, and the Assistant Band Director who is hired by the Centerville City Schools and who determines policies and performances of the Programs.

Article V. Executive Board

The Executive Board shall consist of the Officers of the Association plus five members of the Association appointed by the Officers of the Association who shall serve as Executive Board Directors. The Directors shall be responsible for:

- A) Finance;
- B) Operations;
- C) Marketing and Advertising;
- D) Student Affairs;
- E) Communication.

Article VI. The By-Laws

The Officers, Executive Board Directors, and all appointed subordinate positions shall be bound by the duties and responsibilities specified in the By-Laws of the Association.

Article VII. Modification

A three-fourths majority of the members present at a duly constituted General Meeting is required to accept proposed changes to the Constitution.

Article VIII. Ratification

This constitution was ratified by a three-fourths majority of the Association at the duly constituted General Meeting held on December 6, 2016.
